MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

Guardian Fundamental All Country Equity ETF (the "Fund") seeks to achieve long-term capital appreciation by investing, directly or indirectly, primarily in equity or equity-related securities with exposure to global markets. In order to achieve its investment objectives, the Fund invests, directly or indirectly, primarily in equity or equity-related securities of issuers with exposure to global markets. The sub-advisor of the Underlying Funds employs a disciplined, fundamental bottom-up approach to security selection. The Fund is broadly diversified by issuer, sector and geographic region, without being subject to minimum or maximum allocation constraints by country. Under normal market conditions, the Fund targets a range of 60-90% allocation in developed market equities and 10-40% allocation in emerging market equities. At least initially, the Fund will seek to achieve its investment objectives by investing in one or more investment funds, including investment funds managed by the Manager or an affiliate thereof. This Fund invests all, or substantially all, of its assets in other investment funds, including Guardian Capital Funds [the "Underlying Funds"]. Individual securities referenced in this commentary refer to the securities held in the Underlying Funds, not a direct holding of this Fund.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in the Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. The Fund may be suitable for investors with a medium tolerance for risk, particularly those who seek exposure to equity securities of issuers with business operations around the world.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value increased by 1% to \$3.3 million at June 30, 2022 from \$3.2 million at December 31, 2021. Of this change, a decrease of

\$0.7 million was due to investment performance and an increase of \$0.8 million was attributable to net subscriptions.

The ETF Units of the Fund posted a return of -20.0% for the period. The Fund's benchmark, the MSCI ACWI Index (Net C\$), returned -18.5% for the same period. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, where applicable for the Series, unlike the benchmark's return.

The Fund is a fund-of-fund structure with investments in the BMO Concentrated Global Equity Fund and the Guardian Emerging Markets Equity Fund. The Fund has a strategic mix of 70% Global and 30% Emerging Markets exposure. The Fund suffered along with the drawdown in global equities with both global and emerging markets equities falling fairly equally during the period.

The Fund lagged its benchmark in the first quarter as inflation and rising interest rates boosted Value stocks at the expense of Growth stocks, which the Fund's underlying holdings are biased towards. In the second half of the period, Quality stocks outperformed helping the Fund to recover some of the lost performance from earlier in the period.

Stock selection within the underlying Funds' in the Consumer Discretionary sector contributed to relative returns. The Fund's underweight allocation to the strongly-performing Energy sector detracted during the period, as did the overweight exposure to the Consumer Discretionary sector also dragged relative performance during the period.

Within the BMO Concentrated Global Equity Fund, positions in Novo Nordisk and UnitedHealth contributed to performance. Novo Nordisk produced its strongest quarterly growth in more than two decades driven by accelerated demand for GLP-1 treatments and obesity. The company also raised its 2022 forecast for sales growth. UnitedHealth has benefitted from its US domestic focus and operating in an industry where inflation is not unusual. Within the Guardian Emerging Markets Equity Fund, the position in AIA Group contributed to performance. AIA Group, a pan-Asian life insurer, saw continued strong growth in new business generation in its key markets of China,

Malaysia and Singapore. Ongoing balance sheet strength enabled management to announce a US\$10 billion buyback program.

Within the BMO Concentrated Global Equity Fund, positions in Illumina and Nike each detracted from performance. Illumina's quarterly results came in ahead of market expectations and the company reaffirmed core full year revenue growth. The stock is under pressure due to uncertainty around antitrust investigations in Europe and the US related to the Grail acquisition, the loss of a patent case, a competitor coming out of "stealth mode" claiming it can sequence at \$100 per human genome and the departure of its CFO. Nike's sales growth has been held back by supply chain issues and the impact of lockdowns in China. Quarterly and full year sales grew less than expected, with China sales down 20%. As supply issues are largely rectified and China is beginning to open up again, Nike expects to deliver low double-digit revenue growth for the next fiscal year. Within the Guardian Emerging Markets Equity Fund, the position in MercadoLibre contributed to performance. MercadoLibre's operations, as Latin America's leading e-commerce operator, has remained resilient but the market's valuation of the company has consistently decreased.

The Fund did not make any allocation changes in its portfolio during the period. Within the BMO Concentrated Global Equity Fund, there were no new holdings and no positions were exited during the period. Within the Guardian Emerging Markets Equity Fund, its position in EPAM Systems was exited after it was determined that its business was likely to be seriously impaired by Russia's invasion of Ukraine. The Fund has a slight underweight to Emerging Markets relative to its long-term 30% strategic weight, which we expect to maintain until we see greater visibility of economic growth and the trajectory of global monetary policy. In the second quarter, the Guardian Emerging Markets Equity Fund also initiated a position in Hong Kong Exchanges & Clearing, a trading venue connecting mainland China with capital markets in the rest of the world. The company benefits from secular growth driven by the liberalization of China's financial system.

Recent Developments

As the economic cycle slows, inflation remains elevated and global central banks continue to tighten monetary conditions, the Fund expects to maintain its current slight underweight to Emerging Markets, which typically underperform during periods of tighter liquidity and weaker growth. However, valuations are reasonable and the outlook for Chinese growth improving, yet uncertain, somewhat offsetting these concerns.

Related Party Transactions

Guardian Capital LP, the Manager of the Fund, is considered to be a "related party" of the Fund. The Manager is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Fund and also acts as the portfolio manager, managing the investment portfolio of the Fund. These services are in the normal course of operations and the Fund pays a management fee to the Manager for these services, based on the average Net Asset Value of the Fund. The Manager is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Guardian Capital Group Limited, a publicly traded firm listed on the Toronto Stock Exchange.

This Fund invests all, or substantially all, of its assets in other investment funds, including Guardian Capital Funds. With respect to investment in related funds, the Manager has relied on the approval that it has received from the Independent Review Committee ("IRC"). The approval requires the Manager to comply with its current policy and procedures regarding investments in related issuers and to report periodically to the IRC.

The Manager has retained GuardCap Asset Management Limited, a related portfolio manager of the Manager, to act as sub-advisor of the Fund. GuardCap will directly or indirectly manage the portfolio of Fund. Where applicable, the management fee includes any sub-advisory fee that the Manager pays directly to the sub-advisor. With respect to the appointment of and payment to its affiliate as sub-advisor for the Fund, the Manager has relied on the positive recommendation that it has received from the IRC. The recommendation requires the Manager to comply with its current policy and procedures regarding the selection of an affiliated sub-advisor and to report periodically to the IRC.

Management Fees


Unhedged ETF units are subject to a management fee which is based on a percentage of the average NAV during each month, calculated and accrued daily, and payable monthly. The management fee is 0.85% per annum. The services received in consideration of the management fee include investment management and other general administration services. In the event that the Fund invests in another investment fund to obtain exposure to the constituent securities, the Fund may pay the management fee on the portion of the Fund's assets invested in the other fund, regardless of whether the fund is managed by the Manager or an affiliate of the Manager.

Past Performance

The performance information shown assumes that all distributions made by the Fund in the periods shown were reinvested in additional units of the Fund. This performance information does not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or other optional charges that would have reduced returns or performance. Past performance of the Fund does not necessarily indicate how the Fund will perform in the future.

Year-by-Year Returns

The bar charts show the Fund's performance for the period from January 1, 2022, to June 30, 2022 and annual performance for each of the prior years shown, and illustrates how the Fund's performance has changed from year to year. ^[2] Distributions were paid in cash or certain distributions were reinvested in additional units of the Fund. Immediately following such reinvestment, the number of units outstanding was consolidated so that the net assets per unit following the distribution and reinvestment is the same as it would have been if the distribution had not been paid.

^[3] The tax characteristics of distributions are reported annually by the Fund to CDS Clearing and Depository Services Inc. ("CDS"). CDS makes this information available to brokers who provide it to unitholders through standard tax reporting.

^[2] The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions, other portfolio transaction costs and withholding taxes) of the Fund and its proportionate share of the total expenses of the Underlying Funds, where applicable, for the stated period, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the year. The Manager absorbed some of the Fund's expenses, if it had not done so the MER would have been higher.

^[3] The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs of the Fund and its proportionate share of the Underlying Funds' portfolio transaction costs, where applicable, expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value for the period.

^[4] The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively its portfolio advisor trades portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in the portfolio once in the course of a year. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of an Fund.
